School Group Packages: Multi-day Experiential Learning & Reconciliation School Programs

Our interactive land-based learning experiences are facilitated by local knowledge keepers. Learn the history specific to Odawa Mnis (Manitoulin Island) that includes the topics of residential schools, treaties, and Indigenous rights. Multi-day programs also allow you to explore Manitoulin's finest attractions, scenery, and landmarks.

Day One Itinerary:

AM Travel day
PM Check-in Manitoulin Hotel and Conference Centre, Little Current ON
Welcome dinner and introduction to Anishnaabek teachings
Craft making activity

Day Two Itinerary:

AM The Unceded Journey guided tour: learn the history of Odawa Mnis (Manitoulin Island) and Wiikwemkoong Unceded Territory—Canada's only officially recognized Unceded Indian Reserve. Visit historic sites including 1836 Treaty historic site, Holy Cross Mission Ruins (residential school site), Smith Bay trading site

Culinary Experience: Cook lunch using pre-colonial cooking methods and freshly foraged ingredients
