The Anishinaabek people of Wiikwemkoong Unceded Territory have lived on Manitoulin Island since time immemorial. The village of Wiikwemkoong is on the eastern




portion of the island and along the beautiful and pristine shores of Georgian Bay. Our vibrant community expresses its Anishinaabek culture through several events that draw visitors from all over the world. Some of those events include the annual cultural festival, fall fair, ice fishing derby,

traditional pow-wow, and aboriginal theatre in the ruins of a historic Church.

We invite you all to visit Wiikwemkoong and also our beautiful Point Grondine Park which is situated near Killarney, Ontario. Enjoy the wilderness through one of our many private and community operated tourism services. Our land base provides plenty of opportunities for both a wilderness experience and to enjoy the culture of our people.

Point Grondine Park is operated as a recreational park and has over 7000 hectares of scenic natural wilderness landscape, old growth pine forest, stunning river vistas and eight interior lakes to explore. The picturesque water trails flowing along the coast of Georgian Bay invite you to many canoe routes, hiking trails and backcountry campsites located throughout the interior of the Park. Hike, canoe or sea kayak along the traditional routes of the Anishinaabek people and be ready to be captivated by this historic and majestic place.

We are conveniently accessible by road and by boat. Our Tourism Information Center is centrally located and provides travelers with in-depth information pertaining to Manitoulin Island. Take part in our guided historic experiences or stop in our gift center for authentic locally hand-made crafts.

# **Hnishinaabe Culinary Experiences**

### Stone Cooked Venison & Tea

Forage wild edibles that you will use to create your venison dish cooked on flat rock over the open fire, and enjoy hot or cold herbal teas made from local plants.

### Clay Baked Trout & Tea

Harvest your very own ingredients to prepare fresh caught Georgian Bay trout stuffed with sage, mint, sumac and honey; that you wrap in plantain then bake in coals. Use your harvested plants to also make hot and cold herbal teas!

### Cedar Plank Georgian Bay Trout & Tea

Use natural plants that you collect on a nearby hike to season fresh caught Georgian Bay trout cooked over a cedar plank drizzled with fresh locally-made maple syrup. Complete your dish with wild rice, and hot or cold herbal teas.

# Paddle the Night Sky

Our guide will share teachings of traditional aquatic plants and medicines until the sunlight fades into the night sky, and then you will become engaged in the stories and legends of the water spirits, history of the trading routes and ancient battle sites with the Iroquois. Complete your tour under the dark sky with a relaxing tea composed of natural ingredients foraged from the land, as you sit by the fire and learn about the ancient teachings of the star-world and constellations that connect the creation stories and language of the Anishnaabek people.

# The Unceded Journey

Through our Unceded Journey Tour, experience the history of Odawa Mnis (Manitoulin Island) and Wiikwemkoong — Canada's only officially recognized Unceded Territory. Our guide will take you to four historic sites to view plaques and monuments and recount the history of Manitoulin Island. This educational experience will share the 1836 and 1862 treaties of Manitoulin Island, intrigue you with the local lore and legend of Zhibzhii the underwater spirit, and take you back in time to the now infamous "Manitoulin Incident".

# Bebamikawe "Making Footprints"

Hike a portion of the Bebamikawe Memorial Trail along the Niagara Escarpment while our guides share medicinal plant teachings, stories of encounters with voyageurs, battles with the Iroquois people, and our relationships with settlers. Manitoulin is known as being one of the most plant diverse areas in North America and we have designed our hiking trail to flow through this diverse ecological habitat. Culinary Add ons available.

# Bay of the Beaver

Paddle the canoe route of our ancestors and experience the history of the Wiikwemkoong fishing islands. This tour departs from Meeshkodewaang (Prairie Point), located at the northern shores of Wiikwemkoong,

and leads you to the islands along beautiful Lake Huron. This tour will follow the shoreline of Prairie Point overlooking the La Cloche Mountain range. Your guide will captivate you with local legends and historical facts while you take in the picturesque scenery. (Cancellations will be made in the event of inclement weather)

- Spectacular lookouts capturing views of the La Cloche Mountains, North Channel and the Traditional Fishing Islands of Wiikwemkoong.


