The Anishinaabek people of Wiikwemkoong Unceded Territory have called Odawa Mnis (Manitoulin Island) home since time immemorial. Located on the island's eastern shore along the pristine shores of Georgian Bay, Wiikwemkoong is a vibrant community where visitors can experience Anishinaabek culture through the Wiikwemkoong Arts and Music Festival, Annual Cultural Festival, fall fair, traditional pow-wow, and Anishinaabe Giizhigaat (National Indigenous Peoples Day) Celebration.

We invite you to explore Wiikwemkoong and Point Grondine Park, situated near Killarney,

Ontario, where over 7,000 hectares of diverse wilderness offer hiking, canoeing, kayaking, camping, and eco-accommodations. Bay of the Beaver

Paddle the ancestral canoe routes to the historic Wiikwemkoong fishing islands along Lake Huron. Depart from Meeshkodewaang (Prairie Point) and enjoy stunning views of the La Cloche Mountains while your guide shares local legends and history aboard the chi-cheemaun (big canoe) accommodating up to 8 participants. *(Cancellations will be made in the event of inclement weather)*

Attendees can enjoy several forms of art and take part in workshops and teachings at the event as the people of WUT invite all to join in name of unity and in spirit of allyship.



Wiikwemkoong Annual Cultural Festival

Witness the finest dancers from across North America as they share their intricate dance styles and traditions at Eastern Canada's longest running pow-wow and Manitoulin's premier event.

In addition to the dancing, there is an array of authentic native food and craft vendors you can explore on the pow-wow grounds. Enjoy and explore the Cultural Pavilion that offers history, cultural etiquette, and traditional teachings of the Anishinaabek people. Complementing the festival, each year organizers invite an international group who shares their unique culture through performances, and workshops in the Cultural Pavilion.

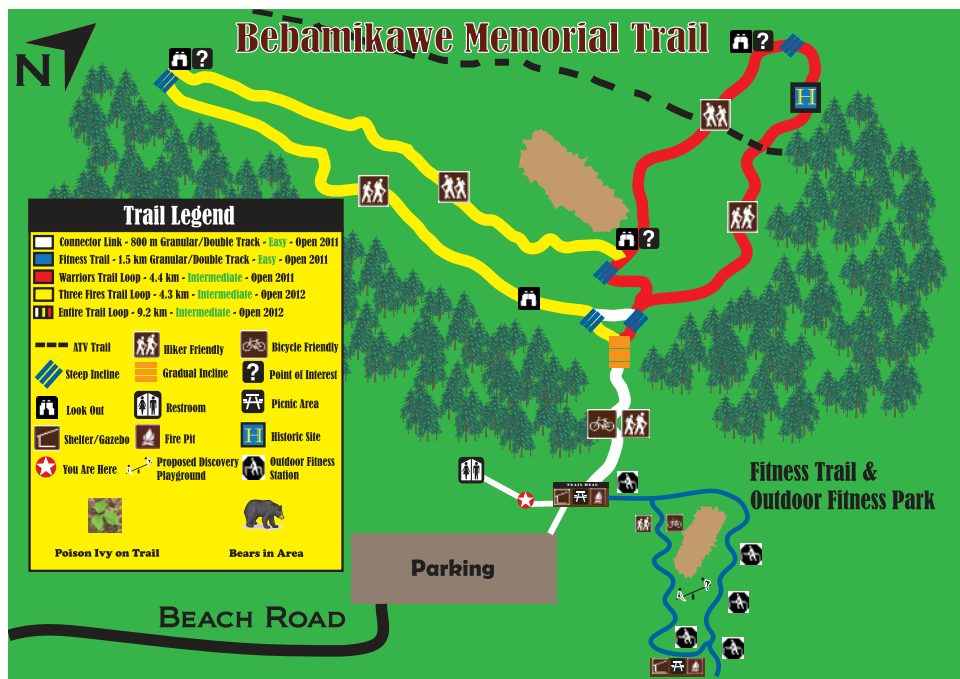
BEBAMIKAWE MEMORIAL TRAIL

- ✦ Educational signage at each lookout.
- ✦ Outdoor Fitness Park - 1.2 km fitness trail with five fitness stations.
